CAPITAL CAMPAIGN CONSTRUCTION COMPLETED New Education Center, Redesigned South Entrance



Visitors, volunteers and staff were all in agreement when the Haggin's new ground floor entrance and Malloy Education Center were completed in December 2011: the wait was worth it!

From the multi-functional classroom facility to the beautifully landscaped entryway and ADA-compliant restrooms, this project has increased the museum's capacity for providing educational outreach and visitor accessibility.

The ambitious seven-month construction project was the final element in a series of building improvements tied to the Haggin's 75th Anniversary Capital Campaign and was made possible by generous gifts from Marian and the late George Malloy.

The Education Center named in their honor is the capstone to this couple's long tradition of service to and support of the Haggin. Marian was a charter member of the Junior

Women's Group auxiliary (organized in 1963) and George—who passed away in August 2010—served as a member of the museum's Board of Trustees from 1966-1996.

Some of the events in this issue of the Bulletin will be held in the new classroom facility, which enables the museum to provide expanded programming for children and adults. It can accommodate up to 35 students and includes sinks, storage space and an Education staff office.

The project has also increased the museum's accessibility, enhanced the building's aesthetics and improved the overall visitor experience. The south entrance of the museum now features glass doors, improved signage, new landscaping and reconfigured handicapped parking area.

81st ANNUAL ROBERT T. MCKEE STUDENT ART CONTEST & EXHIBITION

February 2–April 1, 2012

The annual Robert T. McKee Student Art Contest & Exhibition—the longest-running student art competition in the United States—returns in February 2012 featuring a new collaboration with the Stockton Symphony.

The exhibition was first envisioned by founding patron Robert T. McKee, whose goal was to encourage students by providing a public venue for their artworks.

Every year the invitation is sent to all public, private and charter schools as well as homeschool groups in San Joaquin County. And every year we receive on average 1,000 pieces of art chosen by teachers as the best of their class.

Due to the immense number of entries, the walls of the West and Tuleburg Galleries are covered from top to bottom with two-dimensional art works. In addition to photographs and mixed-media pieces, these include works created in crayon, colored pencil, pastel, watercolor, oil and acrylic paint. Sculptures and other three-dimensional works are displayed on pedestals throughout the two galleries.



Exhibition Judge Selected

Marlese has been the director of the San Joaquin Delta College gallery since May 2007.

With a degree in Arts Administration from the University of Minnesota, emphasizing arts education and art history, she has worked in the field for more than 20 years.

In her position for the Minneapolis Arts Commission as Public Art Program Manager, as Administrative Manager for Zeum at Yerba Buena Gardens, and as Executive Director for the Napa Valley Arts Council she has worked to include youth in many of the arts programs she developed.

These programs were developed out of her belief that the arts promote and engage students in the process of learning, creative problem solving, and in building self-esteem.

Symphony Premiere to Inspire Student Art

In the spirit of collaboration between arts institutions, we are also pleased to announce a partnership with the Stockton Symphony which brings a thematic focus to this year's exhibit. The Symphony has commissioned Israeli Composer Avner Dorman to create a symphonic piece based on a children's book called

Uzu and Muzu from Kakaruzu. Set for its Stockton and world premiere in March, this fable of misunderstanding compounded through generations teaches an important lesson about conflict resolution.

The Haggin is inviting teachers who participate in the McKee Exhibition to help their students create artwork based on the themes of conflict resolution: communication, compromise, empathy and respect. Special prizes will be awarded to upper and lower division students whose work exemplifies an artistic interpretation of this very current human reality.

DOCENT COUNCIL

Docents Attend National Symposium in St. Louis

After months of planning, Docent Council President Lorrie Hoslett, Vice-President Judy McGrew and Parliamentarian Nancy Sharp left on October 2 for the National Docent Symposium in St. Louis.

They had been invited to present our *Museum2Schools* program at one of the conference sessions. Other presenters included docents and staff from major museums including the National Gallery, Fine Arts Museum of San Francisco, Museum of Fine Arts Boston, Smithsonian American Art Museum, Denver Art Museum, the National Archives and the Chicago History Museum.

Hosted by docents at the Saint Louis Art Museum, the conference focused on a wide array of docent issues including the professionalization of volunteer museum educators, continuing education, making the most of minimal resources, and evaluation; all topics relevant to us at the Haggin.

Twenty-three docents attended the Haggin docent presentation which included a PowerPoint and overview of the three programs that currently go to San Joaquin County Schools: *Acorn Making*, *Looking at Horses in Art* and *Looking at Young People in Art*. These programs were developed, field tested, and evaluated by Haggin docents and education department staff.

Upon reflection, their experience yielded several important observations. The Haggin docents realized that they are being trained in and practicing the same things as the docents from these mostly large, well-known museums. They found significant focus on offering tours with themes and aligning them

with curriculum content standards. Emphasis was put on the importance of their role as informal educators in the museum environment and what they can do to create a culture that fosters intellectual growth and delight.

Docents shared their experience guiding tours using Visual Thinking Strategies, a technique taught at the Haggin. A common goal for all participants is to hear the children say, "We get to go to the Museum today," not "We have to go to the Museum today." Docents know it is up to them to make the museum experience not just good, but amazing.

Grateful for the support that enabled them to go, and eager to put new ideas into practice, these Haggin docents represent the best of this remarkable auxiliary.

This San Francisco day trip will include a visit to the de Young and the Legion of Honor.

The Fashion World of Jean Paul Gaultier: From the Sidewalk to the Catwalk at the de Young presents a provocative, multimedia exhibition of Jean Paul Gaultier, the bad boy of haute couture. Featuring 120 ensembles created by the designer between the early 1970s and 2010, this exhibition spotlights Gaultier's collaborations with filmmakers, choreographers and musicians, most notably Madonna.

The Cult of Beauty: The Victorian Avant-Garde, 1860-1900 at the Legion of Honor is the first major exhibition to explore the unconventional creativity of the British Aesthetic Movement. The artworks on view encompass the manifold forms of Victorian material culture: traditional high art of painting, fashionable trends in architecture and interior decoration, handmade and manufactured furnishings for the "artistic," art photography and the new modes of dress. How fitting that this show's only American venue is San Francisco—the land of Victorians.

2012 EXHIBITIONS BOOSTED BY COMMUNITY EFFORTS

Businesses, community groups and individuals working together with the museum allow us to develop a higher quality product which enhances its educational value and adds to the quality of life in our community.

The museum has a rich history of collaborating with our community on core collection exhibits, special programming and temporary exhibitions. Such community relationships were instrumental in securing and organizing two major temporary exhibitions for 2012: *Fine Feathered Friends: Man and the Birds of the San Joaquin Delta* and *Arte en la Charrería: The Artisanry of Mexican Equestrian Culture*.



Fine Feathered Friends is the second exhibit in the *San Joaquin Roots* series, which is funded through the Tuleburg Endowment. The 11 families who funded the Tuleburg Endowment developed this series to enable the museum to play an even greater role in highlighting the successes and unique qualities of the people, organizations, businesses and natural resources of our region.

We are very fortunate that this exhibition is being chaired by Peter Ottesen, Museum Trustee, Tuleburg Endowment member, *Record* staff writer and great outdoorsman. Pete has the expertise and love for the Delta to make this show one of a kind. Ottesen and Tod Ruhstaller, CEO and Curator of History, have begun meeting with individuals and families in the community who have an interest and love for the Delta and its avian inhabitants. We will be utilizing objects and photographs from their collections to enhance this exhibition, which opens April 19, 2012.

George and Stella Visgilio first approached the museum about hosting an exhibition which focused on Mexican heritage. The museum staff had long had its eyes on the exhibition *Arte en la Charrería: The Artisanry of Mexican Equestrian Culture*, but its rental fee made it cost-prohibitive. After reviewing the exhibit materials and meeting with museum staff, the Visgilio's agreed to be Title Sponsors, which allows us to bring the exhibit to Stockton.

We then coordinated with the San Joaquin County Hispanic Chamber of Commerce to develop a community committee, which is meeting regularly to ensure we maximize the educational elements of this exhibition and reach the widest audience possible. The exhibition opens on September 20, 2012.

We are excited that the 2012 temporary exhibition schedule has provided us the opportunity to expand our community involvement and we look forward to forging new relationships in the future.
